ETHEL F. LORD FELLOWSHIP

Ethel Lord was born in Reading, PA.



She served during WW2 in the American Red Cross in both the European

and Pacific theaters and was the first woman to be appointed Field Director of Camp Services in the Pacific. As a Soroptimist, she served as President of the Asbury Park Club, Secretary and Governor of NAR, President of SIA and President of Soroptimist International. When she died contributions in her memory came from all over the world. These monies were contributed to support the NAR Fellowship with an annual award by NAR renamed for her. Since 1956 Fellowships have been given to women graduates in the field of medicine, government foreign service and gerontology. The fellowship was changed to help a Women Veteran attain her career goals.

We distributed the application to the Veterans Affairs Offices of 11 different local colleges and universities. If you know of anyone who would be interested in applying, please provide contact information to either Carol Colyer or Alice Lubrecht and we will forward.

REMEMBERING HOW WE STARTED

An educational fund was established in our second decade for the purpose of providing well-



higher education.

We sponsored an organizational dinner for the Hazelton Club on May 26, 1952, and the West Shore-Harrisburg Club was sponsored in 1955.

In June 1952 our Venture club was sponsored. This was for young, employed professional and businesswomen who were between the ages of 18 and 35. The Venture Club was disbanded in June 1975 with much regret.

July 5, 1953 was the first meeting of the Second Horizons Club, a Federation-sponsored project. It provided a place for senior citizens to meet and enjoy a special time with meetings at St. John's United Church of Christ. This project continued until September 1974.
