SOLT -- REMEMBERING HOW WE STARTED (THE 1950s)

In 1954 we received the Woman's Home Companion award for service rendered to our local community.

Among other gifts donated by our club in this decade, a portable organ was given to Camp Reilly; three portable record players to the Association for the Blind to be used by pre-school blind children. We provided refreshment for soldiers at the Catholic Youth Center; presented a mirror for the polio ward at Polyclinic Hospital and equipment for the In County Children's Association. A check was sent to the flood relief of Soroptimists in the Netherlands. We served supper for the USO at the YWCA. Collected 1,800 magazines for the Dauphin County unit for retarded children with a check for \$100.

The beginning of the hospital equipment project was probably 1952 and discontinued in the early 1980s. The equipment was loaned for use in homes. A new Friendship club was assigned – the Geneva Club of Switzerland.

After many years of trying to raise funds with bake sales, and many individual and team efforts, it was decided in 1955 to have a big moneymaking affair each year. The idea of the Varieties was tried and was a major fund raiser until 1985. May 1956 a 3-story apartment building was purchased at 1821 North 2nd Street and sold in 1977. These funds were used to establish a service endowment.

GIANT GROCERY CARDS




